Steeple Barton PC: Report for the SBPC Annual and monthly Parish meeting held on Monday 15 th May 2023. The meeting opened with the Chair's annual report followed by elections of the Chair and Vice Chair. Roger Tyers was elected as Chair and Kate Carter-Windle as Vice. The PC thanked Kate Carter-Windle for her dedication and hard work during her 6 years as Chair of the Parish Council. The Clerk gave the annual finance report. The normal monthly meeting then continued. There were apologies from Cllr Parry and Cllr Jackson. Items on the agenda - The Mullins Motor Museumduring a previous meeting a question was raised regarding the noise levels when the cars are going around the track. It was confirmed that the decibel levels would be measured for each car, and there would be sanctions in place if any vehicles exceed the maximum level. The annual internal and external audit statements were accepted and signed by the Chair and Clerk. The annual donation of £2,000 was made to the Playing Fields for the upkeep of the public toilets. Update on traffic calming - work on Enstone hill commenced on the 15th and will take 4-5 days to complete. The PC are waiting a completion date for the 50mph signage up to the Holt. The next stage is to purchase speed indicator devices (SIDS) and the PC are proposing to purchase two portable signs with poles in 8-10 different areas around the village. The PC have received a request from the school to move the crossing point, this will be discussed with Highways to suggest an appropriate place. District Councillor: Following the recent local elections in other wards of WODC the ruling Alliance of Liberal Democrat, Labour and Green parties increased its majority. A significant change is that the Conservatives are no longer the largest party, with 17 seats, having been overtaken by the Liberal Democrats. The arrival of councillors has meant that composition of the various committees has had to be altered. I requested that I wanted to carry on with my established committee roles, so I am continuing with the planning committee, licensing committee (vice-chair) and the audit and governance scrutiny committee. Last week, I did another "grand tour" of the Bartons Ward on a pothole spotting mission, so I can list them all on the Fix My Street website. I let the OCC highways officer know in the hope that he can mark all the holes with white rings at the same time. It looks as if the highways department are gradually sorting the "epidemic" of potholes after what has been the worst year for their severity since I became a councillor. I will keep reminding the highways officer of streets where the general tarmac surface has failed, but which are not deep enough to be classified as a pothole. I have highlighted various streets where some "surface dressing" is needed, such as Kirby Close, Dorn Close, Mill lane, Rectory Crescent and Marshall Crescent (to name but five!)
