Steeple Barton PC: The June meeting was held on Monday 19th with apologies from Councillors McRobie, Cox and Graham. *Update on traffic calming* the new build out on Enstone Road is now in

place, the road has been resurfaced and the white lines repainted. Speed activated signs Councillor Tyers met with James Wright, OCC to look at potential placing of 4 new posts for the signs. This will mean that there will be 8 locations with 4 existing and 4 new poles. The signs will be portable solar powered. It was confirmed that the signs can be placed on either side of the road and turned to the opposite side. The order for 50mph up to the Holt has now been placed. Oak Tree the oak tree recently planted in the playing fields will be moved in the Autumn. The PC have contacted the school to ask if they would like the tree. Another tree will be sourced as a replacement for the playing fields. Street weed spraying the PC are currently sourcing a weed sprayer. Neighbourhood watch Cllr Jackson will be taking this forward by organising a public meeting to gain support, the local PCSO is also happy to be involved, more details to follow. Parking the PC asked PCSO Helen Duffield to attend the meeting to discuss parking issues in the village i.e., badly parked/parking on pavements and junctions. Helen confirmed that it is an offence to park on the pathway if it means the pathway is then obstructed. Notices were left with the Clerk that can be placed on cars if necessary. Traffic mirror the PC received a request for a traffic mirror at the top of Mill Lane. There is a telegraph pole that the mirror could be attached to; the PC will contact BT to ask for permission. District Councillor: Following recent burglaries, there has been quite a bit of correspondence on Facebook about the possibility of forming a structured Neighbourhood Watch group. In talking to those concerned we have decided that a public meeting would be beneficial, especially for folk like me who have limited use of social media. Such a meeting might include items such as security advice on measures. coordinating CCTV footage, and some kind of way of alerting the village, with things like WhatsApp or "buddy" schemes

Look out for posters and information on social media. I have been enquiring about who is responsible for renovating the various street signs on garden walls around Middle Barton, which have faded and are hard to read. Examples include North Street (Opposite the A.M. Hall.), Frances Road, and Woodway Road. To my surprise it is a district council matter not OCC highways, so I am trying to contact the relevant person at WODC for advice.
