Steeple Barton PC: Notes from the meeting held in the Alice Marshall Hall on Monday 16th October - there were 3 members of the public and apologies from Councillors Parry, Rogers, Cox and Graham. Apologies also from Andy Hinton. The minutes from the September meeting were approved and signed. Reports from the County and District Councillors can found website on steeplebartonparishcouncil.org. Items discussed: Traffic calming: the flashing angry/smiley face signs (SIDS) have been delivered and will be erected shortly once positions have been agreed. Donation requests: a request for donations received from St Church towards graveyard maintenance and security measures were discussed. The donation for the graveyard maintenance was agreed; the request for a donation towards security measures will be carried over to the November meeting. Village parking: this was also on the agenda and will be carried over to the November meeting. The PC will ask the local PCSO to attend to join in the discussion. Dead tree: the PC had received an email from a resident regarding a dead tree in Holliers Crescent, the Clerk will request quotes for the work to remove the tree. Planning: Future Plan for WODC up to 2041 -Councillor McRobie had attended a workshop to join in discussions on the three key aspects, 1) draft local plan objectives and potential policy topics, 2) the potential pattern of future development in West Oxfordshire and 3) a call for sites, ideas, opportunities for how land might be used in the future. Notes will be included in the October minutes that will be published on the website after approval at the November Two meeting. planning applications were the agenda on 23/02419/HHD First floor front extension, 100 North Street. As the cut-off for comments was on the 13th the PC had discussed this application via email and a comment was uploaded on the WODC planning portal. 23/00818/OUT Amended Hallam Land Management application for the development of Holliers field. Just before the amended application was posted the PC had submitted a request to WODC asking why things were being posted on the portal after the original cut-off date. The planning officer confirmed that this was not unusual in that applicants were permitted to address objections and technical issues raised during consideration of the application. It is anticipated that this application will be reported to the Uplands Planning Committee on 13th November 2023. Finances The Clerk confirmed the 2nd Precept payment had been received. DONM Monday 20th November in the Alice Marshall Hall 8pm.

District Councillor: I have offered to be trained by OCC Highways to become a "Super User". This means that I will be able to mark potholes with paint, and put them directly on to the works schedule, via the Fix My Street website. There are some limitations in what I am allowed to do. Potholes in roads must be a min 40mm deep, paths and pavements 20 mm. I am only allowed to mark holes within a 30mph or 20mph area, and not on an A or B road. So the main road through the Bartons, and rural roads between the villages I will

report on F.M.S in the usual way. However I can also mark collapsed kerb stones in the designated areas, like on the corner of Frances Road. I have done the initial online training, and await a meeting with a highways official to do a practical session, armed with spray can and lumi jacket. Speedwatch: Even though the new flashing speed indicator signs purchased by the parish council will appear soon, the Speedwatch group has decided that there is still a benefit in our sessions. This is partly to monitor traffic, but also to tell motorists that we are keen to remind them of the speed they should be doing. A session usually lasts 90 mins with a minimum of 3 volunteers are available. One benefit we have found is the camaraderie and friendships that have been established.
