Steeple Barton PC: Notes from the meetings held in January and February. The minutes from the November and December meetings were approved and signed. Donations: The PC received a request from the Playing Fields Committee for funds to assist in the purchase of new equipment for the play area. A donation of £3,440 was approved together with £1,000 from the Destiny Foundation to purchase a Twin Toddler Swing. Drainage and Flood protection: Cllr Tyers recently attended a site meeting with OCC & WODC to look at the hole being eroded on the corner of the footbridge, Mill Lane and the collapsed footpath edge on the Dock. Repairs to the Dock were scheduled for mid-February; we can confirm that all repairs have been completed. The flooding issues in Mill Lane Ford will unfortunately take much longer to solve. The work to the School drain has been delayed until April. Traffic Calming: The SIDS information had been downloaded showing that the average speed through the village was 23.4mph in January and 24.2mph in February. The PC have requested a "Children Playing" sign to put up outside the Social Club. The "School" sign to the East of the School will be repositioned to outside the School grounds. **District Councillor:** On February 6<sup>th</sup> I organised an in-person meeting for the chairs of our local councils to discuss issues arising from the devastating floods before Christmas. Also present was our county councillor, Andy Graham, who managed to persuade four relevant officers from OCC and one from WODC to attend. I had also invited a representative from Little Tew,

who gave an insight into the flooding issues at the head of the Dorn. The flooding problems were outlined in each parish, and possible measures to alleviate future deluges were discussed. The parish chairs and one of the OCC officers are going to contact all the landowners/householders whose properties are fronting the Dorn, to discuss measures that could be undertaken to try to prevent the catastrophic flooding which happened last year. I have taken advantage of the recent dry spell to mark potholes in Middle Barton, and to schedule the action. There were quite a lot of clusters of smaller ones, which came to a grand total of 110! A couple of residents also mentioned loose kerbstones, so I have done a tour and found 40, which have been marked with a white spot. Let me know of any glaring omissions!
