John Barrows Memorial Cricket Match: Sunday, 7th September 2025

Playground: All the items are now installed and the surrounding area has been seeded. When the grass has grown installation will be completed and a ROSPA safety inspection will take place. The playground can then be re-opened. Four of the five new items are straight replacements (toddler swing, junior swing, basket swing, junior multiplay) and the addition (a roundabout) is multi ability and can accommodate a wheelchair. Unfortunately the Toddler multiplay proved to be uneconomic to repair so a replacement is a priority item in Phase Two for which fund raising has already started. Everything is aimed at primary and/or pre-school age groups which are the ages which use the playground. Additional items which accommodate several children at once have been chosen to enable group play and encourage social interaction. We are very pleased to say that the fund raising dinner on Saturday 22nd March was very successful, reaching its target of raising enough to fund the large slide as part of phase two. We thank all those that attended, brought raffle tickets and donated.
