School Bus: the meeting held on 12th November to discuss onoing issues was attended by Cllr Ian Hudspeth and Lucy Butler from OCC. Resolutions; OCC has undertaken to provide transport to Chipping Norton school for all children living in Middle Barton until at least 2021. It is not yet certain whether that will be free or paid but with spaces in other schools being taken, it is likely that Chipping Norton will be the nearest school with available places and transport should therefore be free. OCC and local parents confirmed that parents of children in Yr6 had been contacted and options set out with regard to school choice and provision of transport. We thank OCC for resolving that. There is still an issue about the allocation of free or paid transport for the year group currently in Yr8 and it was clear that OCC's investigations into the basis of decisions had not been sufficient. Lucy Butler agreed to conduct a more thorough review of the mileage calculations in particular which appeared to be in error. Contact her on lucy.butler@oxfordshire.gov.uk. OCC will report back to the Parish Council in time for the December meeting and January Bulletin.
