Bartons Good Neighbour Scheme: was set up to provide support and friendship for those feeling lonely or isolated in the community and for those struggling to get somewhere or complete a task at home. Please get in touch with Mary or Louise on 07486886971 or bartonsgns@gmail.com with any requests, including help with small tasks or perhaps a weekly chat over a cup of tea with one of our friendly volunteers. We can also assist with transport to GP and hospital appointments or a trip to the local shops if no friends or family are able to help. Please note, there is a 45p per mile charge for assistance with transport.

Coronavirus: Steeple Barton PC and Westcote Barton Parish Meeting; held an emergency meeting on Sunday 15th March to discuss the coronavirus situation. This was followed with a telephone meeting on Monday 16th March with villagers invited to attend. Steeple Barton PC has provided the following note arising from these meetings for general circulation. The PC has set up a WhatsApp group invitation via a posting on Facebook asking people to join as community volunteers who will be on hand to help with day to day requirements. Cards that householders can place in their windows will be available to assist the volunteers in identifying needs. A white card would be used for things like shopping, dog walking and prescription collection. A red card would identify that the household requires assistance. If a card hasn't been seen after 3 visits, the volunteer would knock on the door and standing 2 metres away, would check that all is ok. For shopping, the list and money are given to the volunteer and everything is left on the doorstep. Prescriptions; can be collected and delivered by the volunteers. Deddington Surgery already offer a delivery service.

The PC needs a list of vulnerable people and Cllr Jackson will help with this. 31 volunteers have responded so far which is brilliant. A member of the public who joined the call mentioned that there is a slight concern that people will feel even more vulnerable without personal contact. Kate Carter-Windle confirmed that the volunteers will make contact and times would be agreed beforehand. Telephone numbers and email addresses will be collected. The PC will give out information cards. Kate also confirmed that the local churches are willing to get involved in this too. Another caller suggested that we could all help in the community by being available for chats and the WhatsApp group is a good place to start. We could also investigate online book clubs. The latest Government release confirms that anyone over 70, anyone with chronic illness, respiratory issues and pregnant women need to take extra care and would constitute as a vulnerable person. Information will be published in the Bulletin and posters around the village with contact names and numbers for SBPC and Westcote Barton. Jane Wright, the Rector, will give out Pastoral team numbers.

**FOMBS:** Please note that because of the coronavirus situation, all Fombs events are postponed until the social distancing advice has been lifted and schools re-open.

**Open Garden:** Ivor and Barbara Hill will again be opening their garden at The Grove, 81 North Street for charity on 17<sup>th</sup> May from 1.30 to 5pm; entrance fee £4; children free. Tea, home made cakes and preserves as well as the usual plant stall. Proceeds will go to the National Garden Scheme (Yellow Book) which distributes funds to numerous charities including nursing and cancer organisations. Everyone is welcome but no dogs please. Please note, this is subject to coronavirus restrictions.

**Our Library:** Our books for young children are now with Busy Bees so the

children can borrow them from Kate Carter-Windle twice a month at the sessions. We are sometimes offered hardback novels and whilst our readers prefer paperbacks, we are now able to take hardbacks for the Oxford Hospitals Charity bookshop at the John Radcliffe. The proceeds are used to buy a vast range of equipment and resources to support patients in hospital. Books may be left at the library and I will pass them on. Many thanks, Alison Umney.

**Pre-school:** Thanks to everyone who took part in Fitness February to support preschool. We raised nearly £400 and hope you feel fitter as a result! Well done to Isla-Grace and Gemma who won the competition. Our Easter party for pre-school children and their siblings is cancelled. We are preparing for the May Day Fete on VE weekend in May but obviously await a decision on the VE weekend itself. Pre-school is now closed for the time being although all emails will be monitored if anyone wishes to get in touch. We also need new parent and community committee members from September.
