Pre-school: The children are all settling into the 'new normal' and we welcome all our new families. The main topic this term is 'All About Me'. During the holidays, we had the exterior of the building and fences painted so all now looks very smart. In September, we held our AGM and a new committee was formed. We welcome our new committee and would like to say a big thank you to the outgoing one for everything they have done for us. At preschool, we are very aware of the need to care for our environment and work hard to minimise our use of plastic packaging including in the children's lunchboxes! We have finished the display the children started last year; thanks to all those who collected them for the display but the staff never want to see another plastic bottle top!! Speedwatch: The Bartons and Sandford St Martin are fortunate to have been gifted our own radar equipment giving us the capability to effect speed reduction within the 30mph limits of our villages. During lockdown, we were unable to use our Speedwatch equipment but we now have the opportunity to deploy it so we are again appealing for additional volunteers to be added to our list of trained volunteers. Using the equipment is simple

but requires three people in attendance at each outing if we are to report observations to Thames Valley Police. The more volunteers we have, the more visible we become and the greater the impact we will have on traffic calming.

Steeple Barton PC: Report of meeting held on 21st September - a telephone conference due to Covid. We welcomed Stephen Saunders as a new member of the PC. Parking; this is becoming an issue in parts of the village and we urge people to be courteous and neighbourly when parking. We would also remind you that there is plenty of parking at the S&SC when visiting the shop or friends in that area. Carrying on from this and thinking of the environment, if your journey is short walk! Taking the children to school, going to the shop - make it part of your daily exercise regime; help to keep roads clear and do your bit to save the planet. The Bartons Volunteer Group; is still running during this very uncertain time; if you need help, they are there for you (see Good Neighbour Scheme above for more details). Disposable Face Masks; these are being discarded and left for others to pick up. Do not drop them; take them home and dispose of in the appropriate manner. Dog Poo; here we are again! Pick up after your dog! Speedwatch; this group is continuing to monitor the speed of vehicles through the village (see separate item above for more details) and we are still pushing forward with our traffic calming requirements; sadly, these things take time as the wheels seem to turn very slowly but we are continuing on your behalf and doing our utmost to get this done. Lollipop Lady; it has been noted that many children are not using the crossing at Mill Lane which is there for you and primarily, your child's safety. The lollipop lady is there for you; please use the crossing. Councillor for Youth; Cllr Bruce Norgrove has been appointed to this post and will be looking for ways to support the youth and young adults in our Parish. *Next Meeting;* will be on 19th October, 8pm at the AM Hall – Covid permitting. If not, it will be a telephone conference.

Women's Institute: the first piece of good news was that we were able to hold our September meeting. Not all members felt comfortable enough to return but a reasonable number arrived to a very relaxed evening observing all the Covid19 guidelines.
