Steeple Barton PC: Report on meeting held 18th October; During the 15 minutes at the beginning of the meeting for parishioners to ask questions or make statements, Dog Poo Bins (or current lack of them) was raised. It was explained by the Chair that WODC were changing the poo bins to combination bins which would be a great saving on collection costs. The person at WODC responsible for authorising actioning of this had been contacted to explain that they had in fact taken 4 bins belonging to Steeple Barton PC who also pay for the them to be emptied. A request was made to WODC for these to be returned as soon as possible. Another member of the public made a statement about the late notification of the roadworks (or as it turned out, testing of the core of the road surface to see why some parts of the surface

are failing). Also that the whole exercise was a waste of council funds as the letters arrived the day the closure ceased. The PC agreed it was a waste of resources. Update on traffic calming measures and 20mph speed limit; these are moving forward and the decision on the speed limit in not just our village but across Oxfordshire will be voted on on 19th October. We look forward to having some good news in this respect. District Councillor Dave Jackson reported on a meeting between members of the PC and also Westcote Barton Parish Meeting with our new PCSO Ben Hallam - see separate entry above. Parking in Mill Lane: the PC has received correspondence about this which has been noted and discussed with Thames Valley police. Please do not double park as this makes it difficult for emergency services to get down the lane; it is also not thoughtful to others. Please think before you double park or knowingly obstruct visibility up and down the main road for those leaving Mill Lane. School; is doing well with River Learning Trust executives being very impressed on their recent visit. Cllr Carter-Windle was also delighted with the children and their response to the Christmas tree poster when she spoke to them on 18th October.
