Playing Fields and Social Club: Your playing fields and social club need your support. As explained in the DFP, the BVMHF relies on the Bartons Memorial S&SC for a large part of its income. The Club is is struggling financially due to a fall of in membership and a lack of use of its facilities. Without the income from the Club, the Fund would have to severely curtail its activities; the result would be reduced maintenance of the field, severely reduced opening hours for the public toilets, the withdrawal of the free use of facilities village organisations and other cost cutting measures as the remaining income would largely be swallowed up by the costs of insurance, business rates, payment for waste disposal and other essentials. If residents want to continue to have access to all the facilities currently provided, which are

often envied by visitors from other villages, then it is up to you to support both organisations. An easy way to do so is to join the Club (£!0 per adult per annum), use the club occasionally and use the Jubilee Room. Secretary, BVMHF.

Steeple Barton PC: Report of meeting held on 17th January; The main topic on the agenda was the traffic calming proposal. The result of the responses to the questionnaire and open day was that the majority are in favour of the proposal which is now being finalised before being submitted to OCC. Along with Westcote Barton, we have also secured funding towards the project using 106 monies from the Heyford development. The flooding issues are now being finalised with clearing Mill Lane of silt and soil deposits; this will conclude the work on this area. It has been quiet over the holiday period but as the children have returned to school, Busy Bees has also returned; see report above. It was brought to the attention of the council that along with a proposal to fit homes with Eco heating instead of gas boilers., there will be 16 new Youth workers based in Woodstock but outreaching to the children in outlying areas. Cllr Carter-Windle reported that the Jubilee discussions will be underway by the time of the next meeting. The Destiny Foundation Panto trip to which the Council contributed was a huge success; thnks were offered by Cllr Carter Windle. The Village Plan which is being reviewed by the PC and will be completed and posted at the next meeting. Reports from the School Governors and the Playing Fields are on the Parish website. Next meeting-February 21st, 8pm at the AM Hall.
