Steeple Barton PC: meeting held on 16th May; The meeting opened with the Chair's annual report followed by elections of the Chair and Vice Chair and details of the membership of the various committees. Both are attached as Annex A to this months Bulletin. Once the elections were

completed, the normal monthly meeting continued. As usual, the first 15 minutes were given over to the public and a comment was made that the PC should put information out on the two local websites. The Council agreed to investigate this further. Cllr Rosemont confirmed positive developments. The public consultation for traffic calming in the Bartons is now open with an online form and advertised in local media. The Parish Council will confirm that they are in favour of the traffic calming measures. Details will be posted on the website and notice board. Cllr Andy Graham informed the Council that a working party for home/school transport has now been set up to look at the present arrangements. It will meet on 6th June. The annual donation of £2000 was made to the Sports and Social Club for the upkeep of the The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations; These start with the lighting of the Jubilee Beacon and Beer Festival at the S&SC on Thursday 2nd JuneAlso the judging of the Scarecrow competition; 1st prize a bottle of champagne, 2nd prize a bottle of Prosecco and 3rd prize a box of luxury chocolates; all three prizes also include a years membership of the club. Prizes to be given at the Big Lunch on Sunday. Friday 3rd and Satturday 4th are the days to come and see photographs and a short film of a previous jubilee.
