**Steeple Barton PC:** notes on SBPC meeting held in the Alice Marshall Hall on

Monday 20th March. There were 2 members of the village in the audience and 3 apologies Councillor Barry, Councillor Parry and School Governor Ali Umney. County Councillor Roger Tyers declared an interest in the Worton Road Project. The minutes of the last meeting were approved and signed. Reports from District Councillor Jackson who along with Councillor Tyers are due to go on a tour of the village with Chris Grain of Highways to discuss and clarify Highways activities. The Mullins will be discussed at the next Development committee meeting on Monday the 27th of March . Councillor Jackson is on Holiday so Councillor Graham will take his place. Councillor Graham is aware of the intricacies of the application and has attended the Community forum meeting. Councillor Jackson has shared recent discussions with him so he is now up to speed. There will be a site visit to re the Worton Road planning application and will be attended by Councillor Carter Windle. Donations to the Bartons History Group was approved and the Friends of Heyford Station although their second application was declined. Traffic calming Councillor Tyers said there there were no further updates but work on Enstone Hill should commence shortly. Councillor Cox reported that cars were mounting the pavement when leaving the village between the garage and Holliers Road instead of waiting for on-coming traffic to pass. His suugestion was that the depth of the curb should be raised to act as a deterrent. This will be discussed with highways to gauge their opinion. The 50mph sign from the village to the Holt should soon be in place. The Coronation Councillor Carter Windle and Annette Fowler Clerk will attend the meeting at the club on the 29th of March
